

To all students: A message from the Student Support Center

The national government's state of emergency declaration and the Tokyo Metropolitan Government's business closure request were lifted on May 25. Before that, the Student Support Center issued measures to be taken due to the postponement of the start of classes on April 8. The new measures listed below will come into effect as we relax entry restrictions.

Although the state of emergency declaration has been lifted, the dangers that COVID-19 poses remain. The university will continue to update information as the situation changes. Please check for the latest updates on the university website or the like.

Student Affairs Division

1. Service window operations at the Student Affairs Division

The service window at the Student Affairs Division will gradually resume operations starting on Monday, June 29. If you need to complete procedures at the service window, please contact the Student Affairs Division in advance and follow their instructions.

Inquiries via email and other methods will continue. If you have questions on such topics as scholarships, tuition exemption/reduction and dorms, please contact the division via email or other methods. (The information is also available on the Student Affairs Division website's "Scholarship and tuition exemption/reduction page." Please submit the necessary documents by postal mail.

2. Extracurricular activities

Since entry to the campus remains restricted for the time being, as a rule, club activities and other extracurricular activities are suspended regardless of whether campus facilities are being used or not.

To resume extracurricular activities, the university will follow the procedures and guidelines in the attached "About Resuming Extracurricular Activities."

If you must access campus facilities for reasons such as maintenance, please contact the Student Affairs Division to receive permission first.

3. Points to note in everyday life

Voluntary caution by all students is absolutely necessary to prevent the spread of infections in everyday life.

- Please avoid the 3 Cs: 1. Closed spaces with poor ventilation; 2. Crowded places; 3. Close-contact settings such as close-range conversations.
- Please especially avoid meetings and events where many people attend, such as dinner parties.

4. **Student Counseling Room**

In general, remote consultations will continue, such as by phone, from June 29 and thereafter. Limited face-to-face consultations will also be available. Please note that reservations will be accepted by phone during reservation acceptance hours but not at the service window.

Please continue to make inquiries by phone.

5. Health Center Office

Students who are on campus to attend face-to-face classes can use the **Health Center Office**.

6. Periodic health examinations

The periodic health examination scheduled for April was postponed. New dates and other details for the exams will be announced on the university website and by other means at a later date.

7. Volunteer Center

Volunteer activities that the Volunteer Center hosts and takes part in will be canceled for the time being. Please inquire about volunteer activities via phone or email. For more details, please see the Volunteer Center website.
